<u>Eligibility Criteria</u>: For WBCHSE and other Boards, a candidate must pass (10+2) at least four subjects including English as compulsory subject.

❖ Admission to all B.A Major courses will be based strictly on merit. Merit shall be calculated as per the following norms:

Merit = {Marks obtained in English+Marks obtained in the subject opted for Major+best marks of other two subjects [excluding the subject opted for Major and English]} /4

If the Student does not have the specific subject opted for Major in his/her previous Course, the procedure for Merit Calculation will be as follows:

Merit = {Marks obtained in English+Best marks obtained in other three subjects} /4.

❖ A candidate will be allowed to take up Bengali, English, History, Hindi, Political Science & Geography subject if he/she/ transgender has passed the same at the qualifying examination. A candidate will be allowed to take up Sociology or Education, if he/she/transgender has passed in the previous qualifying examination of any stream.

Note: A candidate will be allowed to pursue a maximum of Three Year under a Major Course if he/she/transgender has passed the qualifying Examination in Vocational Stream subjects.

3. **CURRICULUM**

a) General guidelines:-

- A Candidate pursuing Major in a subject will not be allowed to take up the same subject as
- ii. A student pursuing a subject as a Major Course, will have to opt for SEC in the Major
- iii. Two Minor Courses must be different from the Major Course.
- Three Multidisciplinary Courses (MDC) Courses to be chosen from a pool of courses. iv.
- Practical/Tutorial: Every Major and Minor Course will have one Practical/Tutorial. ٧. Wherever there is a Practical, there will be no Tutorial and vice-versa.
- A student will have to study two papers each from two Ability Enhancement Courses vi. (AEC), and two papers of Value Added Courses (VAC).
- A candidate pursuing Major in a Language subject will be allowed to take another vii. Language subject as a Minor Subject.

b) Guidelines for Four Year Under Graduate Program with Honours with Research

Students who secure 75% marks and above in the first six semesters and wish to undertake research at the undergraduate level can choose a research stream in the fourth year. They should do a research project or dissertation in the major discipline under the guidance of a faculty member of the University/College in the eighth semester. The research outcomes of their project work may be published in peer- reviewed journals or may be presented in conferences /seminars or may be patented.

4. ATTENDANCE

No student will be allowed to take the end semester written Examination if the student concerned has not attended minimum of 75% of the classes held in the course concerned and also in other curricular components.

5. OTHER REGULATIONS

Reservation of Seats: There will be reservation of seats for SC/ST/OBC/EWS/ Differently Able Candidates as per Government Rules. For differently-able candidates' minimum disability at least 40% will be considered.

Session Gap: For admission to the Undergraduate Program there should not be a gap of more than 3 years between the year of Higher Secondary Examination and the year of admission to Undergraduate Program of study.

Session Break: Students who exit with Undergraduate Certificate or Undergraduate Diploma, are permitted to re-enter within 3 (three) year and complete the Degree Program. Students are also permitted to take a break from the study, during the period of study, but the total duration for completing the program will not exceed seven years.

Admission on Transfer: If a student has been admitted to a College, he/she/transgender will not, except as otherwise provided in the Ordinances, be subsequently admitted to any other College without the production of a Transfer Certificate from the Principal of the College in which he/she/transgender studied last.

A student admitted to a College, will not ordinarily be allowed to take transfer to any other College, except at the end of a semester. If an application for transfer is made at any time, other than at the end of a Semester, on the ground of (a) transfer of the parent / guardian of the student from the station at which the College is situated, or (b) reasoned need for a change on the ground of health supported by proper medical evidence, or any other sufficient reason, the Principal may grant the transfer.

A student may apply for transfer within one month from the date of publication of semester end examination and the student should qualify all the previous semester examinations without any back paper(s).

Admission on Transfer should be abided by the following stipulations:

a) A candidate taking transfer from one College to another is required to pursue the same

set of courses of study in both the colleges;

- b) Admission on transfer must not violate the approved intake of the course concerned of the College granting admission. Only in cases of wards of Government employees who have been transferred, a relaxation of intake may be granted with the permission of the Vice-Chancellor;
- c) Cases of admission on transfer must be intimated in writing to the University authority by the College admitting such candidates within a fortnight of such admission without which such admission on transfer will not be recognized;
- d) All other steps and procedures related to transfer will be in accordance with the provisions of the Ordinances.

6. ACADEMIC SESSION

- a) The academic session normally will start in July in each year.
- b) There will be at least 90 teaching days in each semester excluding periods of examination and admission etc. for instruction, field work and dissertation
- c) The academic sessions including the examinations for first, third, fifth and seventh semester are July to December and that for second, fourth, sixth and eighth semester are January to June.

7. EXAMINATION & EVALUATION

a) Eligibility to appear in an Examination

A student will be eligible for appearing at any of the Semesters of 4-year UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAM, fulfilling the following two essential conditions:

- Minimum 75% attendance of lectures delivered in all courses.
- Students should appear in all internal assessments.

b) Internal Evaluation

The evaluation of the students will be a continuous process and will be based on their performances in internal and the Semester End Examination. All the internal continuous evaluations will be conducted by the Teachers of the Department. It will be on the basis of a combination of Mid Term Tests and Reports, or Seminar Presentations, or Class Tests, or Field Work, spread over the entire period of study. The modalities of such assessment be recorded and documents will be preserved by the respective college and those must be placed before a Committee or Team constituted by the University for verification purpose, if required. The Internal Assessment marks will be communicated to the Examination Branch of the University at least 10 days before the commencement of the University Examinations.

c) Final Evaluation

The final evaluation in a course means the total or aggregate of the marks obtained in internal

evaluation and the marks obtained at the Semester End Examination (Theoretical & Practical).

- i. There will be one written and one practical examination (where applicable) at the end of each semester as per the prescribed syllabus in the course concerned.
- ii. In the 4-year Undergraduate Semester system, the Undergraduate Examinations will be held in eight parts: The First & Second Semester for the first year students, The Third & Fourth Semester for the second year students, Fifth & Sixth Semester for the third year students and Seventh & Eighth Semester for the Fourth year students.
- iii. A student has to complete his/her/transgender. **4-year Undergraduate program within a span** of **7 years.**

A student has to complete his/her/transgender 3-year Undergraduate program within a span of 5 years.

- A student has to complete his/her 3-year Bachelor's Degree within a span of 5 years and
 one revival chance for clearing any one semester with SNC between first to sixth
 semesters with the corresponding odd or even semester examinations after completion
 of 5 years. Students availing revival chance cannot opt for seventh and eighth semester
 courses.
- A student has to complete his/her 4-year Bachelor's Degree (Honours/ Honours with Research) within a span of 7 years.
- A student may opt to exit only after completion of first & second semesters having secured 40 credits and after qualifying the first year examination. The student is allowed to re-enter and complete the 3-year undergraduate program within a span of 5 years.
- A student may opt to exit only after completion of first, second, third & fourth semesters
 and having secured 82 credits and after qualifying the second year examination. The
 student is allowed to re-enter and complete the 3-year undergraduate program within a
 span of 5 years.
- A student may opt to exit only after completion of first & second semesters and having secured 40 credits and after qualifying the first year examination. The student is allowed to re-enter and complete the 4-year undergraduate program (Honours/Honours with Research) within a span of 7 years.
- A student may opt to exit only after completion of first, second, third & fourth semesters and having secured 80 credits and after qualifying the second year examination. The student is allowed to re-enter and complete the 4-year undergraduate program (Honours/Honours with Research) within a span of 7 years.
- A student may opt to exit only after completion of six semesters and having secured 124
 credits and after qualifying the third year examination. A student is allowed to re-enter
 and complete the 4-year degree (Honours/Honours with Research) within a span of 7
 years.
- A student who secures 75% marks and above in the first six semesters and wish to undertake research at the undergraduate level can choose a research stream in the fourth year.
- A student who wants to exit finally with a Bachelor's Certificate/Bachelor's

Diploma/Bachelor's Degree has to apply online within 25 days from the date of publication of results of first year, second year and third year respectively duly approved by the Colleges (modalities to be notified later).

- iv. Students should complete internal assessments before appearing at the respective semester examination and the marks obtained will be carried over in case students fail to pass the course(s). All the internal continuing evaluation will be conducted by the teachers of the Department. It will be on the basis of dissertations/projects, term papers, reports, seminar presentations, field work, class tests or any combinations thereof spread over the entire period of study. The modalities of such assessment will be recorded and documents will be preserved by the colleges at least for a period of six months after the publication of the result of the relevant Semester-end Examinations. The University Authority may ask for any such records, if required.
- v. To secure qualifying grade in a Course/Semester, a student has to secure the minimum 30% marks in the Semester End Examination, 40% marks in the Practical Examination separately and an aggregate of 40% marks including Theoretical, Practical and Internal Assessment taken together.
- vi. To qualify in a Practical-based course, an examinee is to appear in the Theoretical as well as the Practical portion of the examination. If a student fails to appear in any of the portion or fails to secure 30% & 40% marks in the theoretical and practical examinations respectively, the student will have to appear in the portion they have failed to secure the stipulated percentage of marks in the next corresponding semester.

vii. Qualifying Marks:

- There will be no qualifying marks for internal assessment but the students will have to appear at the said part of the examination. There will be no scope of re- appearing in internal assessment examination for improvement of marks. Marks awarded in internal assessment will be credited to a student's performance in subsequent chances.
- The qualifying marks for each course/paper will be 40% in each semester taken together of internal assessment, semester end examinations and practical examinations (minimum 30% marks in the semester end examination, minimum 40% marks in practical examinations separately).
 - viii. If a student secures qualifying grade in all courses he/she/transgender will be declared to have qualified the said semester and the result will be shown as Q. However, if a student fails to secure qualifying grade in a particular course/paper his/her/transgender result of the concerned semester-end examination will be declared SNC (Semester Not Cleared). Marks obtained in the internal assessment will be clubbed with marks obtained in the semester end examination before awarding the grade. If a student fails to secure pass grade in a particular Course, he/she/transgender will have to appear in that course/paper only. The internal assessment marks will be retained for next examination(s) with valid chances.
 - ix. The Semester-end examinations will be held in the last month of the semesters, namely December (in the odd semesters) and in June (in the even semesters). The internal assessments will continue through the Semester.
 - All question papers of Major Course and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), will
 only be in English version, except for vernacular subjects. All question papers of

Minor Course, Multidisciplinary Courses, Value Added Courses will be in English/Bengali/Nepali versions and in Hindi version only for the Hindi Medium Colleges.

- All Vocational courses, if any and Vacation Internship, Internship / Apprenticeship, will be conducted by the College, and marks will be submitted to the University.
- All SEC examinations will consist of Theoretical (40 marks) and Practical Components (the latter will have to contain Assignment / Field work / Project / Industry visit / Lab visit as per the concerned UGBoS).
- All examinations of Multidisciplinary Courses (MDC), AEC (Compulsory English, MIL/Alt. English) and Value Added Courses will be conducted in OMR sheets.
- x. **Position in the Merit List:** To qualify for position in the merit list a student will have to pass all the semesters in his/her/transgender regular chances (8 semesters) (Honours/Honours with Research).
- xi. Validity of Students' Enrolment/Registration: A student has to complete his/ her/ transgender 4-year Undergraduate Program within a span of 7 years and a student will be promoted to the 7th semester provided the student clears all the six semesters within a span of 5 years without taking any revival chance. If any of the chances mentioned above is not availed by a student within the stipulated period, the chance will be deemed to have lapsed.
- xii. **Promotion:** In the Semester system, there would be automatic promotion right from the first Semester, till the 6th (sixth) Semester, irrespective of the marks obtained in the previous Semesters subject to the fact that the eligibility conditions for appearing in the examination are satisfied. A student has to clear all the six (6) semesters to be promoted in the 7th semester and after completion of the 8th (eighth) semester within a span of 7 (seven) year will be declared passed with Honours/Honours with Research
